KITCHEN INGREDIENTS

Help purchase the raw ingredients we use to bake granola, bread and cookies.

Chocolate chips for one batch of cookies | \$5

Butter for a batch of maple snickerdoodles | \$7

Flour for one day of baking | \$20

Olive oil for herbed focaccia | \$24

We make our own buttermilk fresh the day of baking.

Your gift to our Donate a Loaf program provides each student with a loaf of bread or a bag of granola to take home so she can enjoy the fruits of her labor and share them with family and friends.

This program also allows us to share our products with neighbors in need and community helpers.

Since the Donate a Loaf program began in 2000, customers have donated

During COVID, your gifts let us share cookies and granola with the staff of several schools.

LOGISTICS

OVENS

\$90/day
\$360/session

Donations allow us to pay our kitchen rental fees for the days we bake.



FOOD PACKAGING

Fund the consumables we need to make and package our food.

STUDENT NEEDS

GET INVOLVED
